Do you ever hear a word or phrase that once you hear it, you can't stop thinking about it? Last week, I had the opportunity to listen to a presentation by Chris Worth, graduate research assistant and instructor at the University of Missouri – St. Louis.

During his presentation, which was about UMSL Succeed, an incredible postsecondary education program for young adults with intellectual disabilities, he used the term, "messy inclusion." He referred to "messy inclusion" as the student's right to make decisions is not contingent upon making the right decisions. Think about that for a moment.

He used the example of a student not showing up for one of their classes, like an early morning Monday class. He said no one is going to make them go to class as no one would show up to your dorm room and make you go to class.

Hopefully, we all have a good support system to give us advice and encourage us along the way, but we're still allowed to make bad decisions. Life is filled with good and bad decisions! It's truly how we learn from our mistakes.

The article Chris co-wrote called, "Messy Inclusion: A Call for Dignity of Risk in Inclusive Post Secondary Education," states, "To strike a balance between risk, dignity, and choice, we must begin by educating...through modeling and providing an authentic experience." "In messy inclusion, we recognize that there is a piece of identity and value that comes out of making a mistake."


#### Meet Allie, our new Targeted Case Manager!
